

My focus at the time was golf, but I have since joined many more groups that allow me to exercise a variety of both mental and physical activity. I had my own circle of friends prior to becoming a Hobbyist, and wasn't necessarily looking for a lot more. Well, I was wrong. Hobbyists Unlimited is, in many respects, a fraternity. What I realized, more than just maintaining strong hydration while playing golf, is how many more friends I acquired after becoming a Hobbyist, and that you can't have too many of them.
