A Double Gold Medal is awarded when all the New Jersey certified wine tasters who are judging a specific wine award it a gold medal.
- This fall the Hobbyist Winemakers' Club will be making a new wine blend. I have asked a number of winemakers' Club veterans what they would like to make. There has been no distinct favorite put forward. Since the time for us to decide is very short, I feel that I must decide for the group. I think that it is time to break out a little bit. Lou Sodano, whose daughter (Doreen) and son-in-law (Joe Chevalier) run the Wine Experience today, was at the dinner last night. Lou started the Wine Experience 25 years ago. He is getting very frail but still has a great wit about him. Anyway, Lou's "favorite every day red" is a Cabernet Sauvignon and Barbera combination. I am therefore proposing that our October 2024 choice will be 75% Cabernet Sauvignon and 25% Barbera.

This includes the cost of making the wine, purchasing the grapes, the bottles, and the labels. The cost per case will therefore be \$4550 divided by 24 which makes the final cost per person \$189.50.
