We will need a minimum of 2 1/2 cases more to be able to make a 50-gallon barrel. Our other option would be to make a 60-gallon barrel which would necessitate the purchase of 4 cases in addition to the 2-1/2 cases previously mentioned. This wine will not be made until April or early May, since the grape growing season in Chile is the opposite of ours in the Northern Hemisphere. If any of those who have already signed up would like to purchase more than one additional case, please let me know. Thank you all for your continued support. #### Winter Programming Recap

Hobbyist Jack Warner's fascinating review of *The Amateur Assassin*, his latest novel, followed the January meeting. Termed a "creepy thriller," the book was an effort that took some 18 months to complete. Jack also detailed the necessary steps to publish a book—the creative, production, distribution, and marketing stages. He encouraged Hobbyists to consider publishing their own works, perhaps based on their own lives.

*Houston, We Have a Problem,* February's presentation by Joe Lennox, was a moving talk about the dangerous mission encountered by the Apollo 13 crew. Mixing slides with interviews with the crew and Mission Control Center personnel, Joe provided a riveting look at the near-catastrophic outcome when an explosion and rupture of an oxygen tank in the service module occurred. Despite not making it to the Moon, the mission was nonetheless dubbed a "successful failure" as the crew returned home safely.

In March, Hobbyist favorite Pat Schuber provided a fresh look at the Presidency of Ulysses S. Grant. Until recently, Grant's two terms that were marked with scandal relegated the former Civil War hero's administration as an abject failure. Now, historians note that Grant's many accomplishments included advancing civil rights for African Americans, creating the Department of Justice, and establishing Yellowstone, our first national park. He also reduced the national debt, championed Civil Service reform, and restored worldwide respect for our young nation.
