# **Meeting Programs Reviews**

Hobbyist favorite **Joe Lennox** presented *Apollo 17-The Final Trip to the Moon* following our General Meeting in January. This risky mission's primary focus was scientific in nature with a geological emphasis. The 12-day journey in December 1972 was the longest in history and was the 11<sup>th</sup> and final trip to the moon. Five mice accompanied the three-member crew (Eugene Cernan, Ronald Evans, and Harrison Schmitt) to help determine the effects of cosmic rays.

In February, Pat Schuber detailed a Somerset, New Jersey, unsolved murder mystery from 1922. The case involved Edward Wheeler Hall, an Episcopal priest, and Eleanor Mills, a member of his choir with whom he was having an affair. This case received nationwide newspaper coverage and was a media circus eclipsed just years later by the Lindbergh kidnapping trial. The case was also marked by jurisdictional battles between Somerset and Middlesex Counties and a compromised crime scene that clearly hampered the investigation. Among the murder suspects were the priest's wife, her two brothers, and a cousin. No one was convicted.

Hobbyist **Mike Hurd** gave a stirring talk in March about the benefit of volunteerism with the help of his partner Penny, a therapy dog. Penny is a four-year-old Sheepdoodle who, despite her 80 pound heft, is gentle and cuddly. She loves people, especially young children, responding warmly to everyone's smiles. Recalling many visits to hospitals and schools, Mike described the positive and oftentimes emotional responses from patients, students and their families when

interacting with Penny. For Mike, these experiences were life changing after losing his wife of 55 years. Helping others gave him inspiration and new purpose in life, and he urged fellow Hobbyists to pursue helping others.
